

Pupil Premium 2017 - 2018

At Baston CE Primary School we know our children well. We track their academic progress carefully and accurately identify areas where each child may need further support to do well across the curriculum. We also focus on the 'whole child' and consider different aspects of support we can give, whether this is academic, emotional, sensory, spiritual, physical or behavioural.

From here we consider a range of intervention which may include: resources, extra adult support, music lesson provision, funding for extra-curricular activities, group work, ICT provision, outdoor learning opportunities etc and we tailor specific support to meet the needs of the individual.

Aims of spending PPG 2017 - 18	Cost	Impact (to be monitored and completed in March 2018)
HLTA teaching independent and group intervention to increase progress (academic and pastoral)	£10,000	English, maths and nurture groups have run to support children entitled to PPG who have been identified via PPMs. All children made progress from start to end of targeted intervention or the intervention was changed. Progress not always evident in formal tracking but IS evident in small step everyday learning - see PPM data, discussion notes and new intervention assessment logs.
Forest School Provision	£7,000	Children have developed hands on skills, their ability to work with others on set tasks. There is evidence of PPG children talking on leadership roles confidently and being able to talk about learning. Forest School has enabled PPG children to access the curriculum which otherwise they would not be able to do.
Music teaching across Key Stage 2 with music specialists from within the Deepings Cluster.	£5,400	The curriculum music teaching and Young Voices experience provides real-life, wider world experience for all children. This expenditure provides children with a great wealth of musical instruments to experience. This has led 10 PPG children to take up 1:1 music lessons.
Educational day and residential visits	£1,000	Children can take part in wider curriculum experiences that they otherwise may not be able to afford. This includes class trips/residential trips and sports fixtures.
Health and Wellbeing	£4,500	PPG children have access to private educational psychology support - Futures in mind. Staff training for bereavement and counselling. Staff training for art therapy. We are building a bank of resources to best support our PG children.
Equipment/IT / resources/uniform to support families in meeting requirements of school policies	£600	Children more confident to come to school in a uniform that matches their peers' etc. Laptop purchased for PPG family to complete homework online.
Music lesson provision to enable entitled children with keen interests to explore and uncover musical talent	£3,276	See above data.
TOTAL EXPENDITURE	£31,776	Expected carry forward -£96.00

Summary

At Baston CE Primary School we endeavour to support ALL of our pupils regardless of his/her 'entitlement' to access additional funding.
