

# Safeguarding in Our Curriculum

## Online Safety

- Taught throughout computing curriculum (see progression map)
- Taught within PSHE curriculum (see progression map)
- Through Collective Worship
- Parent awareness through regularly updates & publications
- Safer Internet Day
- Specific group and 1:1 activities responding to needs of cohorts

## Fire and Water Safety

- Eco-Warriors
- Fire visitors and visits – assemblies/workshops
- KS2 Swimming lessons – water safety session(s)
- Residential visits – raft building, canoeing, kayaking
- Fire drills

## Children Missing In Education

- PSHE topics – belonging, our area
- Celebration of achievements – “it’s good to be me”
- Citizenship – British Values
- School/Christian values and ethos built into the culture

## Drugs, alcohol and tobacco

- PSHE/Science curriculum
- DART workshops for Y6
- Specific group and 1:1 activities responding to needs of cohorts
- First aid policy

## Child Sexual Exploitation

- NSPCC workshop (i.e. PANTS)
- Specific group and 1:1 activities responding to needs of cohorts
- SRE/healthy relationships

## Female Genital Mutilation

- How to be physically and emotional safe
- NSPCC – ‘PANTS’
- Children are taught what part of their bodies are private and about privacy
- Children signposted where to go for help

## Radicalisation and Extremism

- PSHE curriculum (Peer Pressure, Gangs talk)
- Healthy relationships - Celebrating differences

## Stranger Danger

- School visits – risk assessments (briefing/expectations with children)
- Reading texts – class books
- Linked to E-Safety (sharing & privacy)
- Collective Worship
- PSHE curriculum
- Specific group and 1:1 activities responding to needs of cohort

## Keeping Physically Healthy

- Taught through PSHE/P.E curriculum (see progression maps)
- Extra-curricular clubs
- External coaches promoting fitness
- Science curriculum (see progression maps)
- SRE/healthy relationships talks

## Road Safety and Rail Safety

- Road and rail safety assembly
- Residential trips/school visits
- Y2 road safety workshops – practical road crossing
- Visitors to school

## Mental Health

- Nurturing school ethos
- Use of nurture sessions before learning begins
- Specific group and 1:1 activities responding to needs of cohorts
- Awareness days – e.g. Mental Health Week
- Use of wellbeing initiatives for staff and children
- Introduction of mindfulness strategies & moments of reflection

## Bullying including cyber bullying

- Anti-bullying week
- Pupil Parliament
- Daily Active Time
- Safer Internet Day
- E-Safety built into the curriculum (see progression maps)
- Restorative conversations – behaviour policy

## Homophobic or transphobic abuse

- PSHE curriculum – celebrating differences
- Specific group and 1:1 activities responding to needs

## Domestic Violence

- Goals and aspirations
- Healthy relationships education – physically and emotionally (through curriculum)
- Parental signposting
