The STEM zone would allow combining of science, technology engineering and maths in a specially designed area. The HIVE room would be a SEND specific area. #### **STEM Zone**

Being on a small site we have had to get creative in our use of space and love to take on a project. Several years ago we undertook the mammoth but hugely rewarding task of converting a disused double-decker bus into our new much-loved school library. This left behind a small room that is now crying out for its potential to be realised as an inspiring workspace for the school's children and staff to use.

We plan to create with the community a flexible and exciting STEM space to foster discovery, innovation and adventure and to inspire a passion for these subjects for life.

The design incorporates a learning wall with easy access storage, interactive white board, charging trolley for laptops and tablets. The design will include multiple use seating.

Combining STEM subjects in this space will help our pupils understand and be inspired by how these subjects support each other, allowing better engagement and consolidation of their learning. All equipment will be easily and safely stored allowing teachers easy access to items needed for lessons whilst facilitating the transition between STEM subjects to run smoothly.

Crucially the zone will also be an access point for safer internet information making the conversation about online safety an intrinsic element of the children's learning.

The STEM zone layout will enable the flexibility of working independently, in small or larger break out group encouraging the children to become creative thinkers and problem solvers. The space will also develop the children's curiosity and enthusiasm for STEM roles in the wider world, for example Programmers – Astronauts – Chefs – Architects – Analysist – Developers – Physicists, allowing the children to imagine themselves in these important and exciting roles in the future nurturing the passion for these subjects for girls and boys moving forward.

#### **HIVE Room**

We will create an inclusive, safe space in which to learn and that supports the children attending our school with SEND needs. An ideally sized room, currently storing learning equipment, which will be re-located to the STEM zone, will be used for the HIVE room.

We will create a calming, safe area to help children across the school develop their speech and language and encourage independent learning. At the present time only sections of corridors are available for this purpose and so in a designated room, with no through traffic distractions all children with SEND needs will benefit greatly.

By including appropriate seating and table space, the children can relax, have some time out as needed, before re- engaging.

This space will also hold all the documentation required by the SEND support team.

We will need to change the solid wooden door in this room for safeguarding purposes to have a glass panel in it and add carpet and heating.

Following the return to school due to the COVID pandemic, which caused two years of disruption for all children, schools nationwide have seen an increase in the need for specially designated areas to help the children and our school is no different. This space will be of great benefit to all that use it and help our children to flourish.
